THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION (SEC) WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Ms. Bowers called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted. Ms. Bowers agreed to chair the meeting in Chairman Way's absence.

Approval of Minutes

Due to the commissioners not having yet received the December 18th SEC meeting minutes, Mr. Benson made a motion to defer the approval of the minutes to next month's meeting.

Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. All commissioners were in agreement to carry over the December minutes to the February meeting.

New Business

The first item of new business on the agenda was a letter received by the SEC from the Libertarian Party requesting to hold a primary on June 10, 2014 in conjunction with the Republican and Democratic primary. Ms. Andino explained that though the Libertarian Party has used the convention process in the past to nominate candidates, there are concerns that language resulting from the passage of S. 2 (Equal Access to the Ballot Act) could potentially remove convention nominated candidates from the ballot. She stated that the Senate Judiciary Committee is currently considering S. 815 which would clarify the wording in question and allow parties who currently use the convention process to continue to do so. She also emphasized the importance of the passage of this bill prior to the opening of candidate filing on March 16th. Ms. Andino stated that no action was required as of now but she will keep the commissioners updated on the situation.

Mr. Dawson inquired about the impact that a three party primary would have on the SEC and if measures were being taken to prepare for the possibility. Ms. Andino replied that adjustments to the voter registration system would be required but that NWN, the company contracted for the development of the Voter Registration and Election Management System (VREMS), is prepared to make changes as necessary.

The next order of new business was informing the commissioners about the new deadline for submission of annual Statements of Economic Interest (SEI). Ms. Andino stated that March 30th would be the last day to file without penalties in accordance with the new guidelines. She also confirmed that the commissioners would be receiving a statement from the SEC summarizing their compensation from the agency in 2013.

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The final item of new business was advising the commissioners about recent updates to the candidate filing process. Ms. Andino explained that a new component has been added to VREMS to enable electronic filing and that the module is now in the testing phase. The addition will ensure the transparency of the process and will also allow candidate information posted on the SEC's website, scvotes.org, to be current and accurate. After testing is complete, training will be conducted for county election commission staff to facilitate a smooth transition.

Old Business

The first order of old business was updating the commissioners about election-related legislation. Ms. Andino stated that S.815, which was discussed earlier in the meeting, is a current focus and that members of both the House and Senate are aware of the importance of getting the legislation passed quickly. This bill is intended to allow parties to continue to nominate candidates through the convention process. Ms. Andino briefly mentioned two other bills of interest: H. 4364, which would require the SEC Director to post election related legislation to scvotes.org throughout the legislative session, and H. 3197, which proposes to place election authority with the Secretary of State. She stated that she would keep the commissioners informed on these and other relevant bills as the session progresses.

The second item under old business was the letter received by the SEC from the League of Women Voters (LWV) regarding South Carolina's compliance with the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA). Ms. Andino reported that the SEC held a successful meeting with the agencies cited in the letter and it was concluded that the required voter registration service has been and continues to be provided at all of the offices. She informed the commissioners that a meeting will be scheduled between the organizations that filed the complaint and the agencies involved to report the findings.


The next item of old business was the certification request from Election Systems & Software (ES&S). Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that last year ES&S submitted two new scanners and new election management software to the SEC for testing and certification. She reported that though testing has been completed, there are some minor changes to be made to the report before it is released. She stated that she would have the final report ready to present to the commission for next month's meeting.

The fourth and final order of old business was updating the commissioners on pending legal matters. Ms. Andino advised the commissioners that there had been no changes since last month's meeting.

The next meeting of the State Election Commission will be held on February 19, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Ms. White made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION (SEC) WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Reynolds stated the required notice had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated the first item of business was approval of the minutes from the December and January SEC meetings. Mr. Benson made a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

The first and only order of new business on the agenda was informing the commissioners about the recent certification of the American Party in South Carolina. The state's newest party was officially certified on January 23rd bringing the number of political parties currently recognized in South Carolina to eleven. Ms. Reynolds explained that in order to become an official party in the state of South Carolina, a group or organization must submit a petition to the SEC signed by a minimum of ten thousand registered voters currently residing in the state. Election officials verified that the American Party exceeded the minimum with a total of 12,160 valid signatures.

Old Business

The first item of old business was an update on election-related legislation. Ms. Reynolds began by notifying the commissioners that the House Judiciary Committee recently voted not to reconsider H. 3197, the bill that proposes to transfer authority of the election process from the SEC to the Secretary of State. Ms. Reynolds moved on to the next bill of interest, H. 3198, which would give the SEC supervisory authority over county directors and combine all county boards of registration and elections. She stated that the bill is currently being considered by the House Judiciary subcommittee. The final item of legislation discussed was S. 815, a technical cleanup bill intended to clarify language that resulted from the passage of S.2 (Equal Access to the Ballot Act). She stated that Ms. Andino will continue to keep the commission informed of all relevant legislation throughout the session.

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The second item under old business was the letter received by the SEC from the League of Women Voters (LWV) regarding South Carolina's compliance with the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA). During last month's meeting, Ms. Andino reported that after investigating the complaint filed by the concerned organizations, it was found that the agencies cited in the letter have been and continue to be in compliance with the specifications of the NVRA. On January 30th the SEC held a meeting with all involved parties to discuss voter registration activities at their agencies. Ms. Reynolds stated that the groups are still working to identify and resolve any remaining issues but the SEC is hopeful to settle the matter without legal action.

The next order of old business was the certification request from Election Systems and Software (ES&S). Ms. Reynolds stated that the agency will be conducting additional tests on one of the scanners before issuing the final report. Therefore, the decision has been deferred to next month.


The fourth item of old business was to give the commissioners an update on pending legal issues. Ms. Reynolds reported that in the matter of Walters v. Kimpson & Shuman, which challenges the State Senate District 42 election held last year, the SEC has been dismissed from the case. The next matter discussed was the Greenville County Republican Party v. SEC, which addresses voters registering by political party. Ms. Reynolds stated that the case has been appealed to the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals. Ms. Reynolds concluded by stating that no new lawsuits had been filed.

The final order of old business was to remind the commissioners about the new deadline for filing their annual Statement of Economic Interests (SEI). Ms. White asked if the commissioners should have already received their 1099 Form from the Comptroller General. Ms. Reynolds stated that she would check on the status of the forms to ensure that everyone has all necessary information to complete the SEI by the March 30th deadline.

The next meeting of the State Election Commission will be held March 19, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Ms. Bowers made a motion to adjourn. Ms. White seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted.

Chairman Way stated that the only order of business was the request received by the Libertarian Party to hold a primary in 2014 rather than nominating candidates by convention method. As discussed in previous meetings, language resulting from the Equal Access to the Ballot Act has raised concerns about the nomination process, specifically conventions. Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that the Attorney General issued an opinion concluding, "In light of our view of the statute's legislative intent, we believe that Section 7-11-30, as amended by the Equal Access to the Ballot Act, does not require all political parties to adopt a primary nomination process, but should instead be construed as amending the procedure that political parties must utilize if they wish to change from the primary nomination process to a convention nomination process."

After the commission discussed the matter, Ms. White made a motion to support Ms. Andino's decision to deny the request of the Libertarian Party to hold a primary in 2014 based on the Attorney General's opinion interpreting changes made to S.C. Code Of Laws §7-11-30. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, Mr. Benson made a motion to adjourn. Ms. Bowers seconded and the meeting adjourned.

THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated that the first order of business was approval of the minutes from the SEC meetings held on February 19, 2014 and March 10, 2014. Ms. White made a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously and the minutes were approved.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino reported that the 2014 candidate filing period opened on Sunday, March 16th, and was off to a successful start with 373 candidates already filing for various local and statewide offices. She reminded the commissioners that last year's Equal Access to the Ballot Act transferred authority over the filing process from the political parties to the state and county election commissions. As a result, the SEC added a module to the Voter Registration and Election Management System (VREMS) to facilitate the new filing procedures. The addition includes a component which immediately posts candidate filing information to the SEC's website, scvotes.org. Ms. Andino stated that this feature, which has already attracted national media attention, allows the SEC to achieve the main objectives of the updated process: accessibility and transparency. Candidate filing for the November General Election will continue through noon, March 30th.

The next order of new business was the statewide single audit conducted by the Office of the State Auditor addressing federal funds. Ms. Andino stated that there were no findings and the SEC received a clean audit.

Old Business

The first item of old business was an update on the Libertarian Party's request for a primary. Ms. Andino stated that the Libertarian Party has been informed of the SEC's decision to deny their request. She informed the commissioners that Libertarian candidates currently filing

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for the General Election are not submitting filing fees, indicating nomination by convention. Mr. Dawson asked if the threat of a lawsuit was still present. Ms. Andino replied that though no action has been taken to date, the possibility has not been ruled out. She also reported that S. 815, the legislation which will minimize the potential for similar lawsuits, has received a favorable report from the House Judiciary Committee and would likely be passed within the next two weeks.

The next item of old business was advising the commissioners about the status of the budget for fiscal year 2014-2015. Ms. Andino reported that the House recently passed a version of the budget that will provide the SEC with funding necessary to hire an Information Technology Officer and to make essential updates to hardware and software. The bill also allocates \$2.5 million to the agency for a new voting system. Ms. Andino stated that she would keep the commissioners updated as the process continues.

The third item of old business was the legislative update. Ms. Andino stated that several bills pertaining to combined county election and voter registration offices are currently being considered. She reminded the commissioners that last year Judge Thomas Cooper ruled the merging of Richland County's offices unconstitutional, a decision that could lead to other lawsuits questioning the legality of combined boards throughout the state. Ms. Andino stated that the General Assembly is aware of the need to pass a bill before the end of the legislative session in order to avoid further issues. Additionally, two bills are being considered by the House, both of which would give the SEC supervisory authority over county election commissions. Ms. Andino emphasized that at this time the bills are mainly introducing the general concept, not specifying details. The last legislative item discussed was H. 4732, a bill addressing the requirements of conducting Presidential Preference Primaries. The bill received a favorable report from the House Judiciary Committee and is waiting on a second reading. She stated that she would continue to keep the commissioners updated on relevant legislation.

The next order of old business was the certification request from Election Systems and Software (ES&S). Ms. Andino explained that today's meeting was the first of the two-step process for the SEC to officially certify and adopt the election equipment and software submitted by the company. She reported that the software and two scanners successfully passed multiple rounds of testing and analysis and she recommended the certification of Unity 3.4.0.1. Chairman Way confirmed that the commissioners had reviewed the report containing the evaluation results prior to the meeting. Ms. White made a motion to certify the Unity Election System Version 3.4.0.1 and the DS200 and DS850 optical scanners based on results of tests performed by the SEC. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The commissioners unanimously voted to certify the software and two scanners. At a future meeting, the commission will consider approval and adoption of Unity and the scanners for use in South Carolina.

The next item on the agenda was a legal update. Ms. Andino reported that the SEC had been dismissed in the Carolyn Queen case. She stated that no new lawsuits had been filed.

Before the meeting adjourned Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners to file their Statements of Economic Interests (SEIs) before the March 30th deadline.

There being no further business, Mr. Benson made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated the first item of business was approval of the minutes from the March 19th SEC meeting. Mr. Benson made a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. White seconded the motion. The March minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino advised the commissioners that May is Voter Education Month. She stated that the SEC will kick off the month with a press conference and Photo ID event at the S.C. Statehouse on April 30th. The Agency will join forces with the League of Women Voters, members of legislature, the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), and other involved organizations to educate South Carolinians about the importance of registering to vote, updating voter registration information, and having the proper photo identification when heading to the polls. Several county election offices are participating in the event and will have equipment in place to take photos and issue Photo IDs. Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that the June Primaries will be the first statewide election in which the Photo ID law has been in place, making this an opportune time to educate and prepare voters.

The next item of new business on the agenda was the Pew Charitable Trusts' Elections Performance Index (EPI). Ms. Andino explained that Pew is a research and public policy organization that has developed an assessment tool used to measure election performance. Using data from seventeen "indicators", the organization determines each state's ranking in relation to the others, allowing for state-to-state comparison. Ms. Andino stated that though several of the indicators used to determine the EPI are beyond the control of the SEC, South Carolina has moved up seven places over the past four years primarily due to the passage and implementation of online voter registration.

The final item of new business was an update about building security. Ms. Andino stated that the issue of physical security is a continuing concern for the Agency and the other occupants

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of the office building. She explained that the majority of the building space is occupied by the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP), an agency that holds weekly public hearings and has had multiple security issues in the past. PPP has recently been granted funds to purchase scanning and x-ray equipment which will be placed on the first floor of the building. Ms. Andino explained that upon the installation of the new security system, the main entrance to the SEC will no longer be accessible and therefore the current layout will need to be modified. She reminded the commissioners that the 2221 Devine Street building is state-owned and that the Agency has been and will continue to work with Buildings and Grounds Services to implement the necessary changes to accomplish the remodel and installation in a timely manner.

Old Business

The first item of old business was an update about candidate filing. Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that last year's Equal Access to the Ballot Act transferred authority over the filing process from the political parties to the state and county election commissions. This change also resulted in the Agency creating a new module in the Voter Registration and Election Management System (VREMS) to facilitate the new process. Over seven hundred candidates filed for local and statewide offices during the filing period which began March 16th and continued through March 30th. Ms. Andino confirmed that the process was a great success and that the ultimate goals of the process, accessibility and transparency, were achieved with no reported problems and positive feedback from the public.

The next item on the agenda was informing the commissioners about preparations for the June Primaries. Ms. Andino stated that the candidate names and the advisory questions that will appear on the ballot have been certified and that the SEC will be responsible for creating 39 of the 46 county databases. She also mentioned that the SEC is conducting a pre-primary workshop tomorrow, April 17th, in an effort to update the counties on relevant election information and to help them prepare for the upcoming primaries.

The third order of old business was updating the commissioners about Information Technology (IT) security. Ms. Andino reported that she and the Agency's IT staff have been and will continue to attend monthly meetings at the State Data Center. She also stated that the training is being used within the office to raise awareness of possible security threats. The SEC is currently updating the policies and procedures for handling sensitive data to ensure the security of the voter registration system and all sensitive information.

The next item of business was the legislative update. Ms. Andino began by briefing the commissioners on the status of S. 866, which would require all counties to establish a combined Board of Voter Registration and Elections. Though the bill was set for special order two weeks ago, it has not yet received a second reading in the Senate and remains on the calendar. She also reported that H. 3198 has most recently been amended to contain language similar to S. 866, and now addresses the combining of county offices as well as the methods by which political parties are able to nominate candidates. Ms. Andino concluded by stating over the next two weeks there will be minimal legislative activity as both houses are furloughed but there is plenty of time to resolve these issues before the end of session.

The final order of business was the legal update. Ms. reported that the Libertarian Party filed a lawsuit against the SEC earlier in the week. In the complaint the party stated that the SEC

had denied their request for their candidates' names to appear on the Primary ballot. She stated that the Attorney General has published two opinions on the matter and the SEC has acted under the guidance of both of those opinions. The Supreme Court has asked for a return to be submitted by Monday, April 21st, at noon. Ms. Andino stated that the Attorney General's office will be representing the Agency in the matter and she will keep them informed on the progress of the lawsuit.

The next meeting of the State Election Commission will be held on May 21, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.

There being no further business, Ms. Bowers made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Benson seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION (SEC) WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated the first item of business was approval of the minutes from the April 16th SEC meeting. Ms. White made a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The April minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino reported that a resolution honoring John Hudgens, former SEC Chairman, was being prepared. She explained that the Agency traditionally presents resolutions to long-serving board members to show appreciation for their dedication and service. Mr. Hudgens was appointed to the Commission in 2003 and served as Chairman from 2007 until 2012. Ms. Andino emphasized the commitment and leadership Mr. Hudgens provided throughout his nine-year term.

Old Business

The first item of old business was Voter Education Month. Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that a press conference and Photo ID event was held at the S.C. Statehouse on April 30th to kickoff the month. The Agency was joined by members of the League of Women Voters, the Palmetto Project, and several other organizations in an effort to educate and prepare voters for the upcoming primaries. Ms. Andino reported that though several of the planned activities were canceled due to the inclement weather forecast, the event was an overall success.

Chris Whitmire, Director of Public Information and Training, then addressed the commission to provide an update on other Voter Education Month activities and efforts. Mr. Whitmire stated that while voter registration continues to be the focus of outreach events year-round, the attention for the month ahead has shifted from registration to preparation. He stated that encouraging voters to be prepared with the proper identification when heading to the polls is a current priority, along with providing information about absentee voting procedures and deadlines. Mr. Whitmire then informed the commissioners that a new feature was

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recently added to the SEC's website allowing voters to view a sample ballot for the upcoming election. Registered voters can access the sample ballot through scvotes.org and have the ability to view all races that they will be voting on in the June 10th primaries. Providing access to this information prior to Election Day is yet another way that the Agency is working to keep the public informed and prepared.

The next item of old business was an update on preparations for the 2014 Statewide Primaries. Ms. Andino advised the commissioners that since the May 10th deadline to register to vote in the primaries has passed, the SEC has been concentrating on preparing voter registration lists to provide to counties. She added that absentee voting is underway with low activity being reported by counties. Ms. Andino stated that the Agency will continue to provide support to the counties in the weeks ahead.

The third item of old business was an update about building security. Ms. Andino reminded the commissioners that the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP), a state agency that occupies the majority of the 2221 Devine Street building, was recently granted funds to purchase and install new security equipment. She stated that in order to accommodate for the new system the SEC would need to modify the current layout of the office. The major concern, she explained, is the source of funding for the installation and renovation. The Agency has been in contact with members of the Senate Finance Committee and the Governor's office regarding financing for the project, but details have not been finalized. Ms. Andino said that she would update the commissioners as new information becomes available.

The next order of old business was updating the commissioners about Information Technology (IT) security. Ms. Andino reported that she and the Agency's IT staff continue to attend monthly meetings at the State Data Center. She also stated that all SEC staff members were required to complete an online security class in an effort to increase awareness of possible security threats.

The next item of business was the legislative update. Ms. Andino began by briefing the commissioners on the status of the 2014-2015 budget. She reported that the most recent version passed the Senate earlier in the week and is currently being discussed in the House. The current bill does not provide funds requested for seed money to purchase a new voting system, however, the version does grant the SEC \$150,000 in non-recurring funds. Ms. Andino stated that this money would likely be used to develop an audit plan should pending legislation pass requiring the SEC to perform post-election audits at the county level. She stated that she would inform the commissioners whether the budget receives concurrence from the House.

The next legislative item discussed was H. 3198, which addresses several key issues: the combining of county election commissions and voter registration offices, the methods by which political parties are able to nominate candidates and the supervisory duties of the SEC over the county offices to include post-election audits. The bill remains in conference committee at this time. Next, Ms. Andino reported on H. 4732, a technical clean-up bill which removes year-specific language about the responsibility of funding the Presidential Preference Primaries. She stated that she will continue to update the commissioners as the legislative session comes to a close over the next few weeks.

The final order of business was the legal update. Ms. Andino reported that the lawsuit filed by the Libertarian Party against the SEC was heard by the S.C. Supreme Court last month. In the

complaint the party stated that the SEC denied their request to have the Libertarian candidates' names appear on the 2014 Primary ballot. The court ruled in favor of the Agency and determined that language in the Equal Access to the Ballot Act was intended to outline the process for parties that plan to change nomination methods and not to prevent parties who currently nominate by convention from continuing to do so.

Ms. Andino confirmed that the commissioners had reviewed the schedule of upcoming meetings. She suggested combining the monthly SEC June meeting with one of the State Board of Canvassers meetings scheduled in the same month. The commissioners briefly discussed the proposed change and decided to hold the monthly meeting on June 14th with the scheduled SBC meeting. Therefore the next SEC/SBC meeting will be held June 14th at 10:00 a.m.

Ms. Andino announced one additional item of business for the meeting. She stated that Dr. Brenda Williams requested to speak to the commissioners concerning the Photo ID appearance requirements. Dr. Williams is the founder of The Family Unit, a non-profit organization that focuses on improving the conditions of those living in poverty, and is an advocate for voter registration and education. Ms. Andino explained that the Agency has been addressing the various concerns and complaints made by Dr. Williams over the past several years, and continues to respond in detail to her calls and emails. The focus of today's phone call, Ms. Andino continued, is the validity and intent of the appearance requirements for Photo IDs. Dr. Williams then joined the meeting via teleconference and began to voice her concerns about the current guidelines in place for the Photo IDs. She stated that, in her opinion, the SEC has failed to educate voters about the appearance requirements and maintained that many county officials are still unaware of the guidelines. She alleged that voters were being turned away from county voter registration offices for refusing to comply with the requirements and have been denied voter registration cards. Dr. Williams argued that many individuals wear scarves and headdresses in celebration of their heritage and that they should not be required to remove such garments to have their photo taken. The commission listened as Dr. Williams continued to communicate her concerns for the duration of the twenty-one minute phone call. Ms. Andino thanked Dr. Williams for her time and the call ended.

The commissioners then discussed Dr. Williams' concerns and considered possible resolutions to the issue. Mr. Dawson asked if the appearance guidelines were available on scvotes.org, the Agency's website. Mr. Whitmire replied that they were not but can be added under the Photo ID portion of the site. Mr. Snider, Director of Voter Services, explained further that the SEC based the current requirements on those enforced by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and have received no other complaints or reports of complications. After considering the information and the possible solutions the commission decided that making the appearance requirements available to the public through scvotes.org would be an appropriate response to Dr. Williams' complaint. Mr. Whitmire stated that the information would be added and Dr. Williams would be informed of the addition.

There being no further business, Ms. White made a motion to adjourn. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

THE MEETING OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION (SEC) WAS HELD PURSUANT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT AND ALL REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS WERE MADE.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated the required notice had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated the first item of business was approval of the minutes from the May 15th SEC meeting. Ms. Bowers made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The May minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino reported that S. 815 was passed and became effective with the Governor's signature on June 2nd. She reminded the commissioners that at the time of the May SEC meeting a similar bill, H. 3198, was in conference committee. The General Assembly ultimately took language from H. 3198 and amended S. 815 to accomplish three main objectives:

- Legally combine all county boards of registration and elections
- Clarify the language in Title VII specifying the steps a political party must take to change the current method used to nominate candidates
- Give the SEC supervisory authority over the county offices to include post-election audits.

Ms. Andino emphasized the significant impact the law will have on the current relationship between the SEC and county offices. Chairman Way asked what the process would be for intervening at the county level, if necessary. Ms. Andino replied that the response would be determined by the situation but noted that current efforts by the SEC are limited due to staffing constraints. She added that the Agency requested funding for five additional staff members to perform the auditing duties specified by the law, but the General Assembly did not grant the request. Ms. Andino stated that the Agency will ask for the funds again next year. Mr. Dawson asked if the positions would be full-time or if an audit company would be contracted as needed. Ms. Andino stated that the SEC plans for the positions to be full-time.

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The next order of old business was an update on the proposed renovations to install new security equipment in the building. Ms. Andino stated that the SEC requested \$100,000 to finance a portion of the project but the Senate Finance Committee did not to grant the agency the funds. She explained that because the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP) was awarded a grant specifically for the project, the financial committee is of the opinion that the agency should therefore be responsible for the renovations. Recently, a meeting between the SEC, PPP, and other occupants of the building was held to discuss the progress of the project. Ms. Andino stated that she is unsure of the status of the renovations at this point but she would keep the commissioners updated.

Under the legislative update, Ms. Andino reported that the 2014-2015 budget bill passed and it was a successful budget year overall. She reported that the Agency had been granted \$225,000 in recurring funds and \$100,000 in one-time funds for security and technology enhancements. The Agency's request for \$625,000 to recoup statewide election funds was exceeded with \$701,000 granted to the SEC in non-recurring funds. Ms. Andino stated that though the full amount of the request for seed money for a new voting system was not granted, the Agency did receive \$1 million of the \$5 million requested. The budget also provides \$50,000 in funds to hire a consultant to develop an audit plan for the county compliance audits required by S. 815.

Ms. Andino concluded the legislative update by briefing the commissioners on two other bills: H. 4732 and S. 4. She stated that H. 4732, a technical cleanup bill, had passed the General Assembly. The bill removes year-specific language regarding the funding of the Presidential Preference Primaries, specifying the county as the responsible party. The second bill was related to early voting. Ms. Andino reported that House and Senate versions differed from one another significantly and that an agreement could not be reached.

Chairman Way reminded the commissioners that today's meeting of the State Board of Canvassers would reconvene the following morning at 10:00 a.m. He stated the purpose of the meeting will be to certify the results of the Republican and Democratic primaries and to order a recount and/or runoff as necessary.

There being no further business, Ms. White made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned.

Chairman Way stated the first item of business was approval of the minutes from the June 13th SEC meeting. Mr. Benson made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The June minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino reported that July 15th at noon was the deadline for candidates to submit petitions for ballot access for the General Election. Three statewide petitions were received prior to the deadline: one for Governor and one for each of the two U.S. Senate seats. SEC staff counts the number of pages and signatures, issues a petition receipt and sends the petitions to county boards of registration and elections for verification.

The next item of business was an update on preparations for the General Election. A training session has been scheduled for county boards of registration and elections. The all day training session will be held on September 19th. SEC staff has begun the process of creating voting system databases which produce electronic and paper ballots. Additional staffing resources will be brought in from the voting system vendor in order to meet state and federal deadlines for mailing absentee ballots. Training and Certification Program classes have also been scheduled to help prepare county election officials for the upcoming election. Voter education and outreach efforts continue to focus on the new photo identification requirements and voter registration deadlines.

Under old business was an update on the proposed renovations to install new security equipment in the building. Ms. Andino stated that no actions have been taken by the agency and we are awaiting an update from the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP) concerning the installation of the security equipment.

The agency continues to take steps to enhance information technology security. SEC staff has completed one security training class and are in the process of taking the second online

training class. The agency is also in the process of having county users sign confidentiality agreements that govern how voter registration and election data will be used.

Ms. Andino provided an update on the implementation of S. 815. She reminded the commissioners that the new law combines all county boards of registration and elections, clarifies the language in Title VII specifying the steps a political party must take to change the current method used to nominate candidates and authorizes the SEC to conduct post election audits and step in if a county is found to be noncompliant with state or federal laws or SEC policies and procedures. Since the passage of the bill, the agency has held a meeting with some county directors and chairmen and has two additional meetings scheduled. The agency has also developed a statement of work in order to procure the services of a consultant to develop a comprehensive county audit plan.

Under legal update, Ms. Andino reported there has been no change since the last commission meeting.

Under new business, Mr. Whitmire advised that three petition candidates were submitted in a timely manner. If the candidate had 10,000 signatures, they would be on the ballot. Tom Ervin, running for Governor, had enough signatures, and therefore was certified. Brandon Armstrong, attempting to run for U. S. Senate, didn't have enough signatures and was informed of that. Thomas Ravenel had enough signatures, was certified, and will be petition candidate for U. S. Senate seat.

The next item of business was preparation for the General Election. Mr. Whitmire stated that staff is working to prepare ballots and build databases. Deadline to send out absentee ballots to military and overseas citizens is September 20th. General Election workshop for county voter registration staff will be held September 19th. SEC staff is currently working to prepare for that.

Mr. Snider stated that the Voter Services Division Unity Team has begun building databases for the 2014 General Election. The staff will be working seven days a week for the next three weeks to meet deadlines. There's also a special election for Senate District 32 they are preparing for which will impact finalizing the General Election databases. However, the counties are aware and the Unity team has a plan to meet the UOCAVA deadline.

Under old business, Mr. Snider reported that security in the information technology area is being worked on as recommended by the State Data Center for security assessments. Also, the agency has security user agreements to each county for user signature. To date, approximately 98% have been returned. Anyone who uses VREMS is required to sign and return the agreement. Finally, the Legislature approved a full time position for the SEC to hire a security officer. The position has been filled and Ian Chamberlain has been working with us for three weeks now.

Mr. Whitmire stated that the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP) continues to plan for installing security at entrance of our building, which would affect our front door entrance. It is still undetermined as to who will finance the moving of our entrance. SEC is also contemplating the possibility of obtaining additional office space as we currently don't have adequate space for accommodating our current office staff and all that is carried out from this location.

Regarding the implementation of Senate Bill 815, SEC is communicating with county directors and working with them on combining voter registration offices and election commission offices into county boards of registration. Another project that is being worked on is setting up the county election audit process. The audit program development project was kicked off last week. Coeur Group will be in SC next week to conduct workshop with SEC and county staff. They will also visit various county offices. They will deliver program in approximately eight to ten weeks. As far as full implementation, we will need area representatives in place by 2015. SEC is currently looking at partial implementation, sending out surveys and questionnaires and providing guidance, in an attempt to avoid mistakes on the front end instead of having them caught later in audit.

Legal update was provided by Mr. Whitmire who stated that SEC is working with Project Vote regarding the National Voter Registration Act and meeting with various agencies involved. SEC is being represented by the Attorney General's office.

Next meeting is scheduled for September 17th, 2014. Executive Director Marci Andino had previously requested that this meeting be in person due to it being the last meeting prior to the General Election and also because it has been some time since the commission has met in person. If meeting in person on that date is not achievable, it will be rescheduled for October. Commissioner Allen advised he would be able to attend on September 17th date.

There being no further business, Mr. Benson made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. Meeting was adjourned.

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Approval of Minutes

Mr. Way stated that the first item of business was approval of the minutes from August 20, 2014 SEC meeting. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Ms. White and seconded by Mr. Benson. The August minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino explained that the Accountability report is required to be submitted to the budget office each year. The report is used to review agency accomplishments and requests for funding. It details major achievements and goals of the agency. The report is posted on the scVOTES.org website.

Old business

Under old business, Ms. Andino stated that the General Election is 46 days away and that county boards of registration and elections are preparing to mail absentee ballots to overseas and military citizens. The SEC is also conducting a General Election workshop today to prepare counties for the upcoming election. Voting system databases have been sent to counties for testing. Poll manager training materials were sent to counties earlier this week. The Election Commission will also be holding additional training, such as Unity system, setting up voting machines, election night results reporting and vote total audits. Ms. Andino stated about one third of the county directors are conducting their first General Election this year. Special attention will be given to support the new directors. The Election Commission will be reporting the number of absentee ballots mailed to military and overseas citizens to the U.S. Department of Justice. It is anticipated that there will be about 1,000 mailed. State law permits counties to fax and email absentee applications and ballots.

Regarding the Security Update, the Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services (PPP) continues to plan for the installation of a security entrance in our building but there is

no new information regarding when the equipment will be installed at this time. As far as IT security, Ian Chamberlain is now in coordinating information technology security for our agency and he has set up online security classes for all employees.

Regarding the implementation of Senate Bill 815, the SEC hired the Coeur Group to develop a county auditing plan. They have conducted interviews and onsite visits and shared some preliminary information with the agency. The final report should be ready in approximately a month.


For the legal update, Ms. Andino reported the agency is continuing to work with Project Vote concerning voter registration services required by the National Voter Registration Act.

Ms. Andino stated she had responded to a letter from Mr. Jamie Harrison of the South Carolina Democratic Party expressing concerns regarding photo id, allocation of poll managers and training. Mr. Harrison's letter was shared with county boards of registration and elections. Additional information was requested from Mr. Harrison regarding issues mentioned in his letter.

Next SEC meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 15th, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.

Rep. Sabb addressed the commission concerning his reason for withdrawing as a candidate for a legitimate nonpolitical reason and urged the commission to approve the request.

Ms. Andino explained that if Mr. Sabb's withdrawal was determined to be for a legitimate nonpolitical reason, there would be a primary before the General Election and a special election for this seat would be held on December 9th. If the withdrawal is considered to be for political reasons, House seat would remain on the General Election ballot and it would be filled by write in votes.

Mr. Way opened discussion from commissioners. Several commission members expressed their concerns about the definition of a legitimate nonpolitical reason.

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Mr. Way stated the burden would be on the candidate to prove the withdrawal was for a nonpolitical reason. The intent of the law was to prohibit a party from nominating a placeholder candidate who had no intention of holding office (a ghost candidate).

Ms. Andino stated the filing for House of Representatives was in March, at which time Representative Sabb filed for reelection. The vacancy in Senate District 32 did not occur until June, and filing opened in July.

Mr. Benson made a motion to enter into executive session for the purpose of obtaining legal advice, Mr. Dawson seconded the motion. The motion was unanimous. The Attorney General's Office was contacted for legal advice.

Mr. Way stated we were still in executive session and motion to leave executive session was entertained. The motion was made by Ms. Bowers, seconded by Mr. Dawson. The motion was unanimous. All parties present and via teleconference were advised that legal advice from Attorney General's office was not obtained as more time for research was needed by their office.

Ms. Bowers made a motion to recess and reconvene at 2:00 pm. It was seconded by Mr. Benson. The motion was unanimous. The meeting was recessed.

The SEC is also continuing voter education by encouraging voters to download their sample ballots before election day and encouraging voters who are unable to go to the polls on election day to vote absentee. We are also dedicating efforts to educate voters about photo ID requirements. The SEC has also held a meeting and training session with the Richland County director and new commission members. The SEC conducted a training session to help prepare them for the election. The SEC will also be meeting with the U. S. Attorney's office this afternoon in preparation for the election. On election day, we will interact with them regarding calls their office receives from voters.

Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated that the notices had been posted.

Chairman Way stated that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the withdrawal of the candidacy of Robert W. Harrell, Jr. for House of Representatives District 114. Chairman Way stated the SEC is in receipt of a sworn affidavit from Mr. Harrell.

Chairman Way made the following opening statement:

The Commission is keenly aware that the withdrawal of Bobby Harrell as a candidate in State House District 114 presents a unique and unusual situation. The implications of any decision to replace a candidate within five days of a General Election reach far beyond a single House District. This decision could

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have a statewide impact not only for the office in question, but all offices in this election and all future elections.

The Commission has acted quickly, but cautiously because of the closeness of Election Day, public interest in any decision, and this body's duty to protect the integrity of the election process. At each step of the process the Election Commission has been open and transparent. The State Election Commission has no vested interest in the issues surrounding this or any other election other than protecting the integrity of the process and ensuring that voters are able to participate in a fair and impartial election.

The Commission has reviewed the laws governing the substitution of a candidate for a legitimate nonpolitical reason. We have sought advice from the Attorney General's office on the application of those laws, and we have followed that advice.

Today, all interested parties, including the remaining candidates in the race and representatives of the affected political parties will have an opportunity to speak. Specifically, concerns have been raised about the timeliness of the withdrawal. I think it would be appropriate to address this issue first, before any consideration of the legitimate nonpolitical reason is given. At this time, we will allow all interested parties an opportunity to be heard on the timeliness of the withdrawal.

Chairman Way asked everyone who wished to address the Board to introduce themselves.

Mr. Wilkins presented arguments including that the affidavit was not timely, that the affidavit did not meet the requirements of S.C. Code of Laws 7-11-55, and that the reason for withdrawal did not constitute a "legitimate nonpolitical reason."

Mr. Bowers presented arguments including that the affidavit was timely, that the affidavit did meet the requirements of S.C. Code of Laws 7-11-55, that the reason for withdrawal did constitute a "legitimate nonpolitical reason," and alternatively, that replacement was required based on the candidate being disqualified.

Mr. Harrison presented arguments against allowing the replacement of the candidate.

Board members asked questions regarding the timeliness of the affidavit; the application of S.C. Code of Laws Section 7-13-390 within a short time frame of the election; whether a candidate is required to be certified prior to the General Election; the timeframes for holding replacement filing, primaries and a special election; whether the candidate's withdrawal was political or nonpolitical; and whether the candidate withdrew or was disqualified.

Ms. White made a motion to enter into executive session for the sole purpose of receiving legal advice from the S.C. Attorney General's Office. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting entered executive session.

Mr. Benson made a motion to return to open session. Ms. White seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, and the meeting returned to open session.

Chairman Way stated that he would entertain any motions from the Board. Ms. Bowers made a motion that Mr. Harrell is disqualified as a candidate for State House District 114, and that due to this disqualification, the Commission does not accept his withdrawal. Ms. White seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. White made a motion that pursuant to S.C. Code of Laws Section 7-11-55, the filing period for the special election and primary opens on November 4, 2014, which is the second Tuesday after the candidate became disqualified. Ms. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Way stated that a written order of the decision will follow within 24 hours.







Chairman Way called the meeting to order and asked if all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act. Ms. Andino stated that the notices had been posted.

Approval of Minutes

Chairman Way stated that the first item of business was the approval of the minutes from the October 15, 2014 and October 31, 2014 SEC meetings. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Benson and seconded by Ms. White. The minutes were approved unanimously.

New Business

Under new business, Ms. Andino advised the commissioners that the deadline to file protests with the county election commissions for countywide and less than countywide offices was today at noon and that the deadline to file protests with the State Board of Canvassers for federal, state or multi-county offices will be November 17th by noon. The deadline to file protests or appeals of county board decisions to the State Board will be November 24th by noon. If any appeals are filed, they will be heard by the State Board of Canvassers on December 1st through the 3rd, 2014.

Old business

Under old business, Ms. Andino reported to the commissioners that the official voter turnout for the general election was less than 44%, the lowest voter turnout in at least the last 40 years. She further stated that there were no unexpected issues and no long lines were reported in the counties. The SEC received approximately 500

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calls, many of which were related to voters who thought they had updated their voter registration with the DMV. The SEC will be meeting with the DMV to discuss the current process and to address any deficiencies in the process.

The next item for discussion was security. The SEC is continuing to implement the measures recommended by Deloitte and Touche in the security assessments. The SC Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services is in the process of ordering and installing security equipment for the building. It is unknown how this will impact the agency. However, the SEC is searching for additional space, either in this building, in another state owned building or other commercial space to accommodate additional staff that is being anticipated to be hired in order to comply with additional responsibilities granted to this agency by the legislature. If the agency moves to another location, the move would not take place until July of 2015.

The next item on the agenda was an update on county compliance audits. After the General Election, all counties participated in election results audits. The SEC continues to work with Coeur Group and is anticipating an audit plan in early December. It is anticipated that the first auditor position will be filled by early January with the remainder of the staff being hired in July.

Under legal updates, the SEC will be meeting with Project Vote later this year to continue discussions about the National Voter Registration Act. . The Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals heard oral arguments on the Greenville County Republican Party case regarding party registration, on October 29th. The SEC is still awaiting the decision in that case. Ms. Andino stated that the Supreme Court will hear arguments on December 9th in the Mary Tinkler and SC Democratic Party v SC Republican Party and SEC case.

Ms. Andino advised the commission that after the SC Supreme Court issued a stay and ordered the election for House of Representatives District 114 to be held in conjunction with the November 4th General Election, Mr. Harrell's candidate status was changed to "withdrawn" based on the two letters received prior to the submission of the affidavit. This process is consistent with how other candidates who submitted letters of withdrawal have been handled. Ms. Bowers inquired as to whether the SEC is required to hold a hearing or other process in order to consider former House Representative Harrell withdrawn. Ms. Andino explained that it is only necessary to hold a hearing to determine if the withdrawal was due to a legitimate, nonpolitical reason. In this case, the SEC considered him withdrawn based on the letter he submitted to the South Carolina House of Representatives where he resigned his office and informed of his withdrawal from the 2014 election, and the letter submitted to the Charleston County Board of Elections.

The next meeting of the SEC is scheduled for December 17th, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. The SBC will be meeting in person for protest and appeals hearings from December 1st through 3rd if necessary.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Mr. Benson to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Ms. Bowers. The motion was approved unanimously and the meeting was adjourned.
