The State Board of Canvassers met in the office of the Secretary of State at 10:00 A.M., Tuesday, November 12, 1968. Present were: Frank D. Pinckney, Adjutant General; Grady L. Patterson, Jr., State Treasurer; Daniel R. McLeod, Attorney General and Henry Mills, Comptroller General.

Mr. John Stokes reported from the Secretary of State's Office that returns were in from the various County Boards of Canvassers. The returns from the following counties are hereby certified as complete and correct.

The State Board of Canvassers met in the office of the Secretary of State at 12:00 Noon, November 15, 1968. Present were: O. Frank Thornton, Secretary of State; Frank D. Pinckney, Adjutant General; Grady L. Patterson, Jr., State Treasurer; Daniel R. McLeod, Attorney General and Henry Mills Comptroller General.

Mr. John Stokes reported from the Secretary of State's Office that complete returns had been received since the last meeting from the following counties:

Bamberg, Chesterfield, Darlington, Florence, Georgetown, Greenwood, Hampton, Horry, McCormick, Newberry, Pickens and Sumter.

There being no protests or contests filed in these counties, they were certified as complete and correct by the State Board of Canvassers.

The returns for the State and County and Presidential Officials for Cherokee were received and declared correct and certified to, with the exception of the Constitutional Amendments which were not reported.

Constitutional Amendments for Lancaster and Lee Counties were reported and certified to as correct by the Board.

The State and Presidential nominees were reported from Orangeburg County and were certified to as correct. County Officers were also reported from Orangeburg County and certified to as correct.

State and County Officers were received from Berkeley County and were certified to as correct.

Also, Constitutional Amendments were received from Calhoun and Clarendon Counties and certified to be correct.

The appeal, as filed by Honorable P. Bradley Morrah, Jr., asking for a recount of the election for Seat No. 1 of Greenville County, was presented. The Board set Tuesday, November 19,

1968 at 10:30 A.M. for the purpose of hearing both sides of the question. Mr. Morrah and Mr. Wofford would be given a chance to appear in person before the board at that time.

Protests of Mr. Leonard M. Todd, L. W. Brummer, J. C. Plowden, Jr., and Thomas A. Roe over two (2) Constitutional Amendments, voted on statewide but affecting Greenville County only, was presented. The board declined to act on this petition until the complete returns of the Constitutional Amendments for the entire state was presented.

The State Board of Canvassers' meeting was held at 10:30 A.M. in the Wade Hampton Office Building Conference Room, with all members present.

Robert E. Crout, Republican Candidate, County Council, District No. 7, Greenville County, appeared, requesting a re-count for this election in Greenville County. He was heard fully on his protests and it appeared that his chief concern was that some 10,000 more votes were cast and counted in the Presidential election than were counted in his race. He also contended that the law was violated in numerous boxes in that the counting of the ballots were adjourned and interrupted. He further contended that unsworn counters were used in counting the ballots and that ballots were counted in places not authorized by statute. He stated that he had been given a fair hearing in Greenville and that the Greenville Board had decided against him.

In no case could he show the board where any of the things alleged would have changed the results of the election. It was further brought out that the boxes in question were counted under the supervision of the County Board of Canvassers of Greenville County.

After the full hearing, the State Board of Canvassers agreed with the County Board of Canvassers, and declared Mr. William L. Hunter elected with 29,284 votes against Mr. Robert E. Crout with 24,672 votes as County Council, District No. 7, Greenville County.

It was further ordered that a copy of these findings be forwarded to Mr. Crout.

There being no protests or contests in any of the above, they were declared official and Ernest F. Hollings was duly declared elected.

In the Congressional Race, L. Mendel Rivers, First District; Albert W. Watson, Second District; Wm. Jennings Bryan Dorn, Third District; James R. Mann, Fourth District; Thomas S. Gettys, Fifth District and John L. McMillan, Sixth District, were duly declared elected.

The returns from Charleston County were received. There being no protests or contests, they were declared official and correct. There being no returns in Charleston County for the Local Amendments Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, they were not certified. The returns will be sent in later. The findings of the State Board were in accordance with the findings of the majority of the County Canvassers of Charleston.

The complete returns for the Presidential Electors were received. There being no protests or contests, they were declared correct and the following were declared elected:

Mr. Harold Jacobs, Attorney for William E. Reel, Jr., made the following motion:

"I will move that the Board have the boxes, tally sheets, ballots and other voting paraphernalia connected with Senatorial District No. 7, Seat No. 1, be transferred under the custody of this board to the Headquarters of the State Law Enforcement Division, Columbia, South Carolina, and be made available to representatives of either candidate, under the direction of this board after due notice for inspection of the ballots and tally sheets and the inspection be carried out by a Law Enforcement Agent."

Mr. McLeod moved that the above motion be granted and that Mr. McMillan be notified of this action and that it be determined if he has any objection thereto. That if he has any objections, that he be requested to appear forthwith before the board to state his objections. That if he has no objections, that this board request Chief Strom to send officers of his agency to procure ballot boxes in Senatorial District No. 7, Seat No. 1 and all papers relating to this Senatorial Election and that the several Commissioners of Election in Senatorial District No. 7 be directed to deliver the ballots, ballot boxes and all such papers relating to the election to the said officers. That the election materials be brought to Columbia and kept at Sled Headquarters, pending further order of this board and that each party have the right to inspect the ballots with due notice to the other party and under the supervision of a representative of this board, who may be an officer of the Sled.

The above motions were unanimously adopted by the State Board of Canvassers.
