Chairman Wells called the meeting to order. Mr. Knapp advised all notices of the meeting had been posted as required by the Freedom of Information Act.

The first item under new business was the agency budget update. Mr. Knapp stated the governor released his executive budget and recommended funding for the agency first and third priorities. As a reminder, the agency first priority is the establishment of the training division and additional IT staff to support the statewide voting system. The third was the state match for the federal HAVA grant the agency received last year. Mr. Knapp will be attending the House ways and Budget meeting scheduled for the week of January 23, 2023.

Old Business

The first item under old business is the Agency Year-End. As discussed last meeting the agency published its inaugural annual report for agency activities in 2022. A PDF of the report can be found on the Election Commission's website for anyone to review. The last item under old business was the election infrastructure security update. Mr. Knapp stated the agency continues to work with its federal, state, and private security partners to protect South Carolina's election infrastructure.
