

# VOTER GO-TO GUIDE

## 2024 Presidential Primaries

February 3 & February 24

### Pick your Primary

- You can only vote in one primary.
  - The Democratic Presidential Primary is on February 3.
  - The Republican Presidential Primary is on February 24.

### Registration

- Register by the deadline.
  - You must register by January 4 to vote in the Democratic Presidential Primary.
  - You must register by January 25 to vote in the Republican Presidential Primary.
- Register online at [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov) (requires Driver's License or DMV ID).
- Download and print an application at [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov), complete it, and return it by mail, fax, or email to your county elections office.
  - If you have moved from one county to another, you must register in your new county to be eligible to vote.
  - If you've moved within your county or changed your name recently, update your information before election day to help ensure a smoother voting experience.
- Educate yourself on the candidates and issues by seeing who will be on your ballot at [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov).
- **Make sure you have one of the following Photo IDs: SC Driver's License, SC DMV ID Card, SC Voter Registration Card with Photos, Federal Military ID, or US Passport.**
  - If you do not have one of the Photo IDs, make your voting experience fast and easy by getting a free one from the DMV or your county elections office.
  - If you forget to bring your Photo ID to the polling place, you can vote a provisional ballot that will count only if you show your Photo ID to the county elections office before the certification of the election (on Friday after the General Election).
  - If you can't get a Photo ID, remember to bring your non-photo voter registration card with you to the polling place. You may vote a provisional ballot after signing an affidavit stating you have a reasonable impediment to obtaining a Photo ID.

### You're halfway there, now pick how you want to vote!

#### Vote Early

- Any voter can vote early at any early voting center in their county during the early voting period. Go to an early voting center in your county, present your Photo ID, and vote using the voting system like you would at your polling place on Election Day.
  - **The early voting period for the Democratic Presidential Primary starts on Monday, January 22, and ends Friday, February 2. (Closed Sunday, January 28.)**
  - **The early voting period for the Republican Presidential Primary starts Monday, February 12, and ends on Thursday, February 22. (Closed Sunday, February 18 and Monday, February 19.)**
  - **Early voting centers are open 8:30 a.m.- 6:00 p.m. during the early voting periods.**
- Visit [scVOTES.gov](https://scvotes.gov) to find early voting locations in your county.

#### Vote Absentee

- Qualified voters can vote absentee by mail. An example of a qualified voter could be a person with a physical disability or someone who is age 65 or older.
  - To vote absentee by mail, get your application by contacting your county elections office.

#### Vote on Election Day

- Vote at your polling place on election day. Polls are open 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

- **Don't forget to bring your Photo ID to the polling place.**
