












Check Your Voter Registration

Register to vote or check your registration before the 30-day deadline to make sure it is current. It only takes a few minutes & will help ensure a smooth process when it comes time to cast your ballot.

- Register online at scVOTES.gov or in person at your county voter registration office or while receiving services at some state agencies like the DMV. For a full list of places to register, visit scVOTES.gov.
- If you have moved from one county to another, you must register in your new county to be eligible to vote.
- If you've moved within your county or changed your name recently, update your information before Election Day to help ensure a smoother voting experience.

Photo ID Requirements

You must provide one of the following types of Photo ID when voting in person.

- > SC Driver's License
 - Includes standard license and REAL ID
- SC Department of Motor Vehicles ID Card
 - Includes standard ID card and REAL ID
 - Includes SC Concealed Weapons Permit
- SC Voter Registration Card with Photo
 - Available at your County Voter Registration Office
- Federal Military ID
 - Includes all Department of Defense Photo IDs and Veterans Affairs Benefits Card
- US Passport
 - Includes US Passport ID Card

Check Your Sample Ballot

Educate yourself on the candidates and issues by checking your sample ballot at **scVOTES.gov.**

Your sample ballot will be available at least 45 days prior to Election Day.

Vote Early

Any voter can vote early at any early voting center in their county during the early voting period.

- Go to an early voting center in your county, present your Photo ID, and vote using the voting system like you would at your polling place on Election Day.
- > Early voting centers are open 8:30 a.m.- 5:00 p.m. during the early voting period.

Vote Absentee

Qualified voters can vote absentee by mail. An example of a qualified voter could be a person with a physical disability or someone who is age 65 or older.

- To vote absentee by mail, get your application by contacting your county elections office.

Vote on Election Day
