Chairman Shedd confirmed with Interim Director Wooten that there was a quorum present and called the meeting to order at 3:00 pm. Wooten then explained that no members of the public were present.

Interim Director Wooten outlined the elections requiring certification and explained the need to order a recount in House District 21 and a runoff for the Republican Primary in House District 98. She further clarified that the Republican Primary in House District 98 must proceed to a runoff election.

No further discussion ensued.

Chairman Shedd moved to take action en masse on all items presented, seconded by Commissioner Day. The motion passed unanimously.

The State Board of Canvassers voted to certify the results of the following elections and to order recounts and runoffs as required by law:

- S.C. State House District 21 Special Republican Primary Election Runoff
 - Recount ordered.
- S.C. State House District 88 Special Republican Primary Election Runoff
- S.C. State House District 98 Special Primary Election
 - Runoff election ordered to take place on November 18, 2025.

Interim Director Wooten stated that the recount would begin shortly and was expected to take approximately two hours.

The State Board of Canvassers stood in recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The meeting reconvened at 6:00 pm, with Commissioner Day, Moseley, and Edler present via teleconference. Commissioner Moseley chaired the meeting. Wooten stated there was no difference in votes in the recount.

Commissioner Moseley asked if there were any questions. With no further discussion, Commissioner Moseley motioned to approve the recount of the S.C. State House District 21 Special Republican Primary Election Runoff, seconded by Commissioner Day. The motion passed unanimously.

Wooten gave a brief update on Municipal Election Day.

With no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 6:05 pm.
